Introduction


Energy

- Electricity (noticeably smaller influence of municipalities)
- Oil and oil products (noticeably smaller influence of municipalities)
- Natural gas (noticeably larger influence of municipalities)



Transport

- Road, rail, sea, air
- Municipal roads
- Control and safety: police and (inter)municipal (city) police
- City-scheduled passenger transport



Food

- Production, processing,
 distribution, sale → food chain
- Importance of shorter food chains
- Goal of municipalities: local food self-sufficiency → support for local farmers and protection of agricultural land



Drinking water supply

- Water sector: Drinking water supply, water quality control, water quantity control
- Constitution of the Republic of Slovenia (Art. 70): "Everyone has the right to drinking water"
- Provision of (quality) drinking water through self-governing local communities



Healthcare

- Private and public healthcare providers
- Fundamental services
- Maintenance of health
- Municipality and medical centers



Finance

- Economic safety; banks,

- Increased usage of electronic banking
