CRIMINAL OFFENSE MOTIVATED BY PREJUDICE



IT HAS TWO ELEMENTS:

- THE COMMITTED ACT CONSTITUTES A CRIMINAL OFFENSE ACCORDING TO THE GENERAL CRIMINAL LAW.
- THE PERPETRATOR INTENTIONALLY CHOSEN A VICTIM OR TARGET WITH A PROTECTED CHARACTERISTIC.

ACCORDING TO THE ORGANIZATION FOR SECURITY AND COOPERATION IN EUROPE, THE NUMBER OF REPORTED HATE CRIMES IN EUROPE HAS INCREASED BY 47%





IN EUROPE, ACCORDING TO DATA FROM THE EUROPEAN AGENCY FOR FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS FROM 2020, 37% OF PEOPLE WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE LGBTI COMMUNITY HAVE EXPERIENCED AT LEAST ONE INCIDENT OF VIOLENCE OR A THREAT OF VIOLENCE DUE TO THEIR SEXUAL ORIENTATION IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS

THE EUROPEAN UNION AGENCY FOR FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS' 2020 REPORT STATES THAT BETWEEN 2013 AND 2018, A TOTAL OF 141,542 HATE CRIMES WERE REPORTED IN EUROPEAN UNION COUNTRIES.







TWO HATE CRIMES IN MONTENEGRO

The murder of a 24-year-old Albanian, F. Đ., which occurred in October 2020 in the city of Ulcinj. The investigation showed that the motive for the murder was of national and religious nature.

In August 2021, in the town of Bijelo Polje, a group of Roma people were attacked and two individuals suffered serious injuries. The motive for the attack was racist, as the attackers used racist insults during the attack.


