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# Cyberbullying in Slovakia

- Dependency on communication via internet and social networks.
- Transition of bullying into cyberbullying.
- According to a national research cyberbullying encountered 20% of Slovak youth.
- Raising of reported numbers of cyberbullying 1 July 2021 the § 360b of Criminal law has become effective.
- Opportunity for crime prevention specialists.

**Goal:** introduce ongoing peer-to-peer workshops in local primary and highschools on the topic of cyberbullying.



### Prevention of cyberbullying in local schools

Faculty of Security Engineering of the University of Žilina

Žilina City Police Department, Section of Crime Prevention.

- Peer-to-Peer workshops.
- Team of well prepared university students under supervision of local police officers and prevention specialists.
- Goal = efficiently approach youth and enlighten them in topics of cybersecurity, cyberbullying, data protection and help for victims.
- Workshops are accompanied by a PowerPoint Presentation, short videos and a custom leaflet.



#### **Custom leaflet**






- In a time period from 9 January 2023 to 31 March 2023 → 16 workshops.
- Very positive feedback from local schools, demand for future workshops.
- Collection of data and personal experience from youth for further investigation.

#### **Observations:**


- high interest for topics such as criminal investigation, cybersecurity and protection of personal data,
- willingness to share personal experience with cyberaggression,
- willingness to explore possible precautions.

 Have you ever observed cyberbullying, online harassment or other form of cyber aggression while using social networks?






Do you know some webpage or contact information where you will be able to find help as a victim of cyberbullying or cyber aggression?
