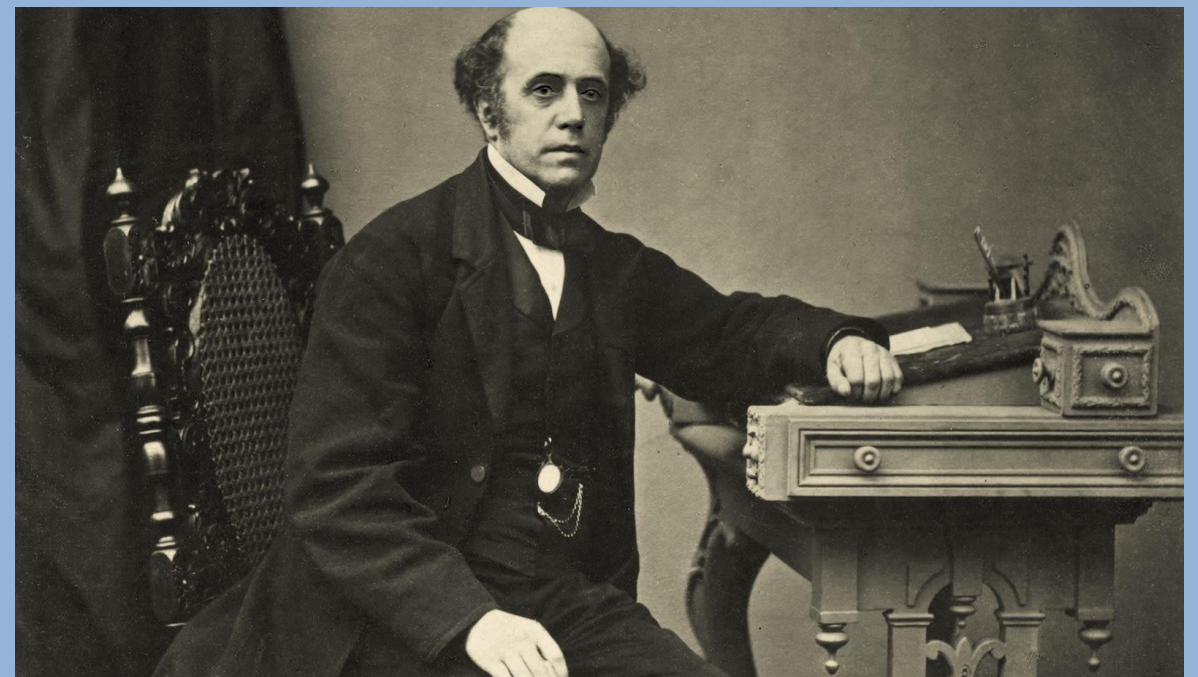

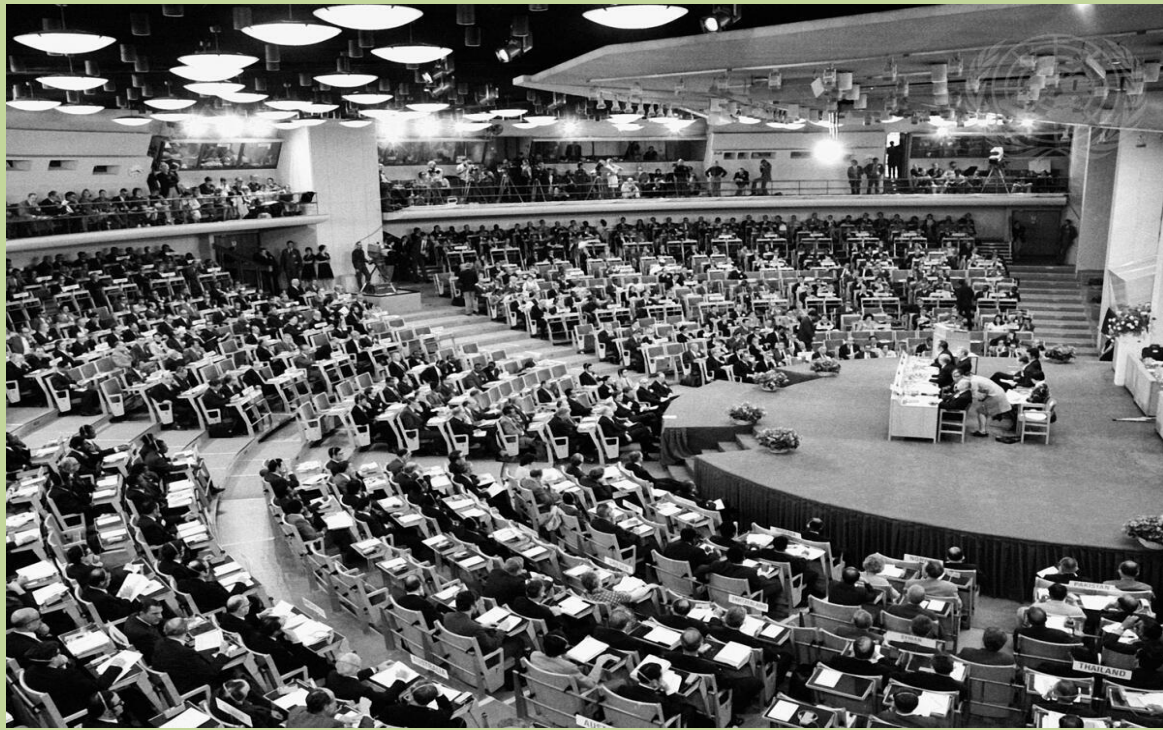
Introduction

- The Rio Conference on environment and development, 1992



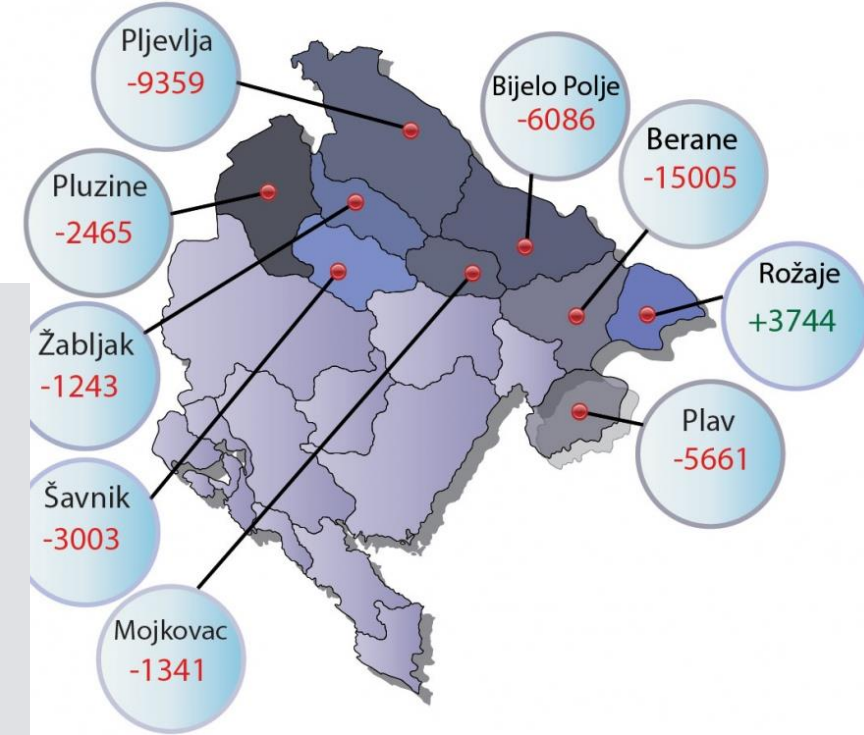
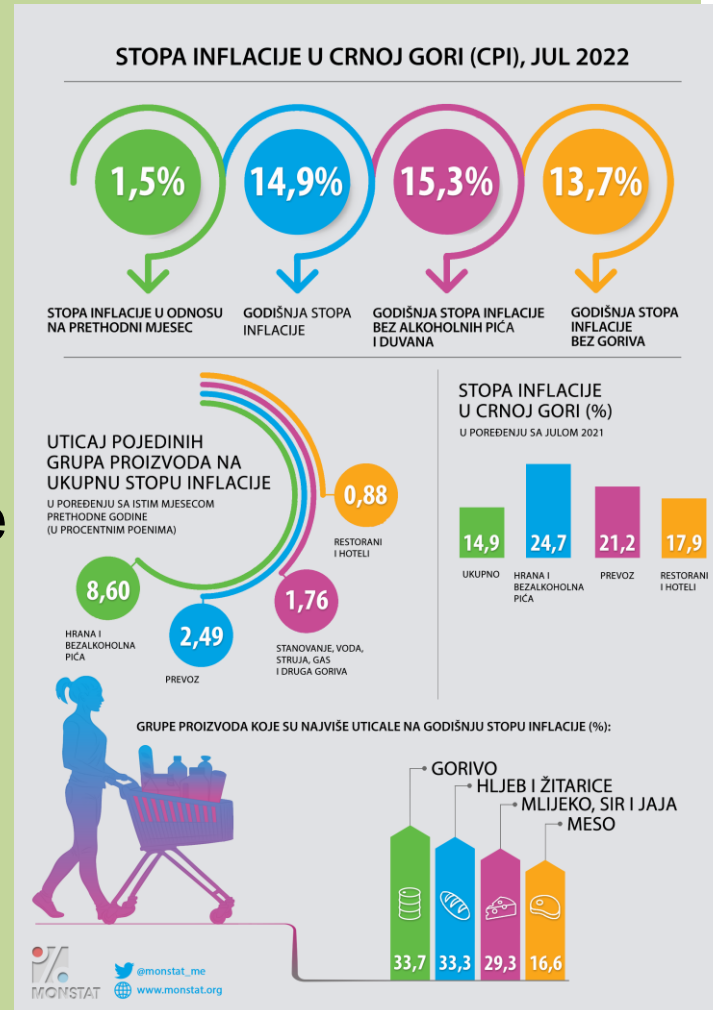
2. Harmful effects on nature
