### D. Additional requirements

UKLIVERPO 02: If students are interested in studying at one of the Erasmus+ partner institutions they will need to contact the relevant coordinator within their subject area. The host must confirm the placement in writing, as well as that the placement must be academically suitable and agreed with the student's Erasmus Academic Coordinator. The placement must be in one of the 33 European countries that is not the student's country of residence (i.e. the 28 EU member states plus Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia). It has to be a well-organised placements that assist students to acquire practical experience and add practical skills to the knowledge and qualifications that have previously been gained through either formal or non-formal education. The placement must be carried out under guidance of a competent supervisor and have clear evaluation criteria of the placement period, for a minimum of two months and maximum of one year.

- 3. Termination of the agreement

This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.
